

GENERAL 2017

- Brad Coffman and Patrick Foley were re-elected to their third terms.
- After approving to aggregate their electric supply, residents of Wayne Township and the Village of Corwin saw new rate of .0529cents/kWh with Dynegy Energy effective for three years.
- Exterior lighting at the Wayne Township Administration Building was converted to LED providing for increased visibility and energy savings.
- The Administrative Building saw several updates including the replacement of nearly half of its doublepaned windows and a new air conditioning unit.
- Wayne Township saw another farm accepted into the Local Agricultural Easement Purchase Program. An additional 60 acres were added to the over 160 acres previously accepted into the agricultural easement program.
- Wayne Township launched the *Wayne Township Community Magazine*.
- Eagle Scouts from local Boy Scout Troop # 51 performed a preservation project at Caesar Creek Pioneer Cemetery.
- Completed a bi-annual Audit by the State Treasurer's Office.
- Created two new lighting districts for

ROADS DEPARTMENT: 2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- Tons of salt used: approx. 325 tons
- Gallons of Beet-Heet[®] used: approx. 2100 gallons
- Miles of roadway maintained: over 43 miles or 86 lane miles
- Chip-Sealed approx. 9.25 miles of township roads
- Crack-Sealed approx. 10 miles of township roads
- Completed 4 rounds of mowing
- Accepted Trillum Dr. for public maintenance.
- Awarded over \$46,000 for road signage improvements through ODOT grant program.
- Bridge was replaced on Pence-Jones
- Upsized a culvert pipe on Ellis-Lincoln and O'Neall Roads
- Performed crack/base repair to Hacker Farm Lane
- Completed the "re-fit" of the 2008 International Dura Star with electronic speed control salt spreader and pre-wet liquid de-ice system
- Purchased new 7' John Deere rotary mower
- Participated in the Mary L. Cook Library "Touch-a-Truck" program
- Re-bermed Middletown Rd. west hill

- □ Continue with facilities maintenance




ZONING/DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT: 2017 HIGHLIGHTS

- Revised and updated Zoning Code went into effect in April along with a new fee schedule
- Updated the Future Land Use Map predominantly reclassifying horse farms as agricultural activity rather than recreational property

Overall permits were up

41% with new single



family homes nearly tripling and residential additions increasing 50% from 2016

- Last remaining lot in The Reserve of Waynesville subdivision built-out
- Bridge Wired, LLC is expanding fiber optic network across the norther end of Wayne Township
- Issued nearly two dozen violation notices: 17 concerning property condition (12 resolved); 7 other violations (5 resolved)
